SAMUEL, KINGS & CHRONICLES THE DIFFERENCES & SIMILARITIES

Samuel and Kings were written around 550-560 BC during the Babylonian exile, and addressed the hardhearted Jews experiencing exile and captivity.

Chronicles was written after the exile was over, around 450-440 BC, and seeks to inspire hope and faith in God among those who are hurting after this spiritually devastating ordeal.

The fact that these two accounts of Israel's history are given to different audiences accounts for the contrasts between the two. While Samuel/Kings needed to show the people that the nation's troubles were the result of their sinful disobedience rather than God's abandonment of His people, Chronicles wanted to encourage the Israelites and help them turn back to worshiping Yahweh as the one true God.

A Focus on David and Solomon - Chronicles focuses heavily on David and Solomon. When discussing these rulers, the spotlight is on their triumphs rather than their respective failures of adultery and idolatry.

A Focus on Judah - A second distinctive is that Chronicles focuses primarily on the kings of Judah, the house of David, rather than the kings of Israel.

A Focus on Restoration - While Samuel/Kings acknowledges that God dealt with the wickedness of Israel's kings by punishing even their descendants, Chronicles focuses on God's dealing with obedient and disobedient kings within their own lifetime.




